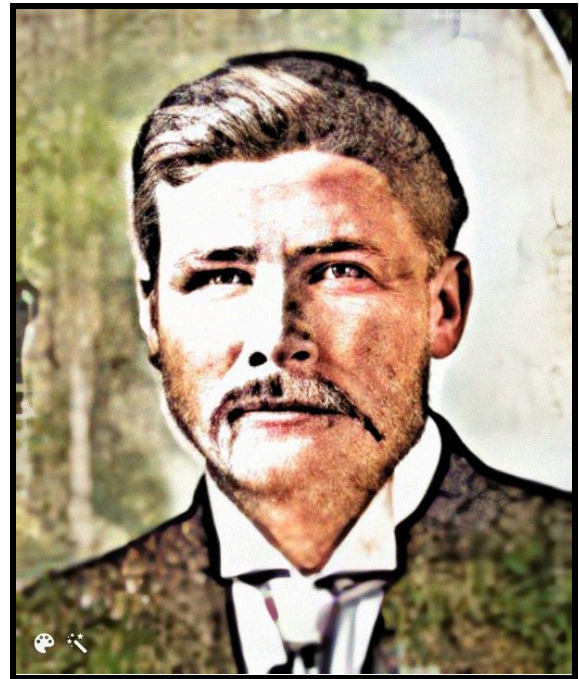
William Wenke, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Wenke Sr., was born in Wisconsin, April 18, 1872, and was 65 years of age at the time of his death. When 2 years of age, his parents came to Plattsmouth, where he grew to manhood.

He was married to Miss Belle Cook Jan. 4, 1900, and they continued to make their home at Plattsmouth for four years, moving then to Pierce county. The family made their home on a farm 8½ miles north of Norfolk until March, 1934, when they moved to their present home at Thirteenth street and Omaha avenue. Since coming here, they had operated an oil station.

Mr. and Mrs. Wenke were the parents of five children, three sons and two daughters. Two sons preceded their father in death, one in infancy and the other in 1926. Surviving are his wife; a son, Wilson H. Wenke of Norfolk; and two daughters, Mrs. Opal Kennedy of Pilger and Mrs. Grace Caauwe, Norfolk. He also leaves six grandchildren, and a brother, George, of Norfolk.

Interment was in Prospect Hill cemetery with the following nephews as pallbearers: Glen and Ellsworth Wenke, Spencer; Harold Wenke, Burley, Ida.; Edward Boedeker, Plattsmouth; Lowell Cook, Norfolk, and Dwight Cook, Gandy, Neb.

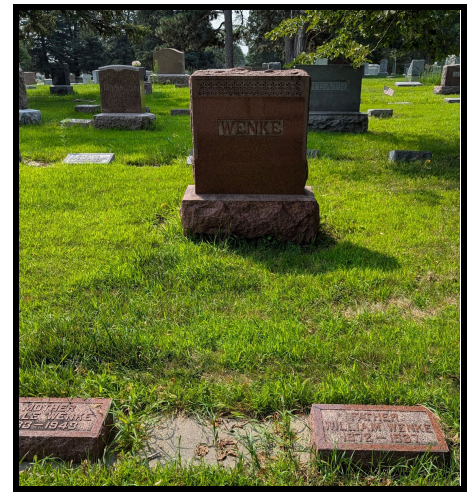
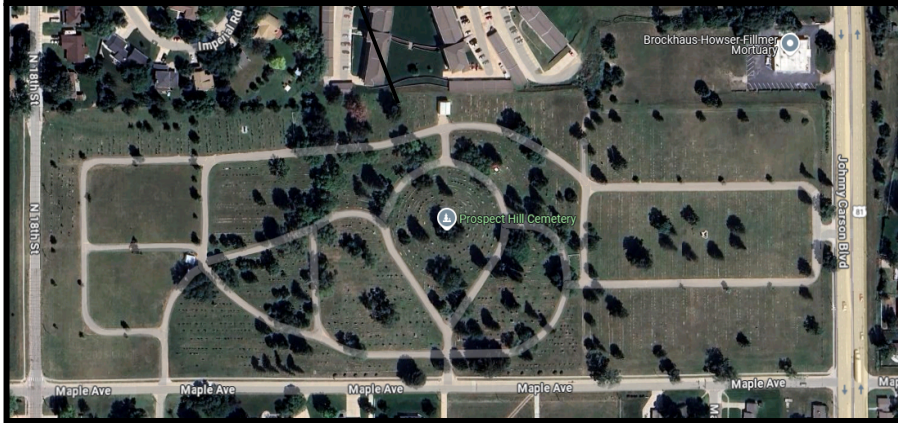
